State Alumni Convention is Getting Closer

Registration is still open for the annual Wisconsin FFA Alumni & Supporters Convention which will be held on February 2 & 3, 2024 at the Hyatt Regency and KI Convention Center at 333 Main St in Green Bay. Registration is open through December 31, so be sure to get registered on time. Go to https://wisconsinaged.org/alumni-state-convention to complete your registration.

There are 2 different registration options, one is for all those who served as a past state FFA officer or past state alumni council in either sections 6, 8 or 9, entitled past leaders registration. All others should use the general registration option. You are able to pay with a credit card at the time of registration, or submit payment with a check through the mail after registering.

If you are wanting to order convention themed clothing, you may do so by going to https://customcreationsofwi.com/wiffa alumni/shop/home. If you order by January 1, you should be able to pick up your clothing at the convention. They will have other merchandise for sale at the convention, but if you want something with this year's theme, you need to order it ahead of time.

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General Convention Details

- Registration will close on December 31, 2023 and
 we can not take late reservations. Due to supply
 chain shortages and deadlines we must have final
 numbers to ensure that we can meet our expectations of excellence. We would sincerely appreciate
 it if anyone plans to mail their registrations that
 they be mailed by December 20th, in order to ensure their receipt to the treasurer by the closing
 date.
- Hotel accommodations are the responsibility of each individual attending. Rooms are blocked currently but will be released after January 2, 2023.

- Room rates are \$ 98 for a single person and \$ 20 for each additional guest, plus taxes. Please note that these are all suites so they have extra space for a kitchenette, and there are king or 2 queen options.
 The living area also has a pullout sofa option. They are very nice rooms.
- There is a tour option available that will leave at noon to tour the Green Bay Southwest Ag Department on Friday, February 2. The group will then head to Title Town for the classic Packers tour at Lambeau Field, which will be followed by a self-guided tour of Hinterland Brewery, which includes a complimentary beer. The tour has a 60-person maximum, so individuals are encouraged to register early, as it is first come, first serve in the registration process. Cost of the tour is \$ 60 and includes busing and all tour costs. The reservations are filling up fast, so be sure to get registered soon if you plan to take the tour.
- For those who do not want to participate in the tour
 on Friday afternoon, something new this year will
 be a make and take option for individuals. There
 are two different workshops being planned.
- 1. Option 1 Succulent Bowl /glass art project drop-in session from 1- 4 PM. People can stop in any time

- from 1-3 to begin, but they need 1 hour to do the activity. The cost is \$25.00. There is a minimum of 20 participants or it would be cancelled, and due to supplies, etc. there is a maximum of 40.
- 2. Option 2 Wood Flower arrangement to make. This is also a drop-in session running from 1 to 4. The cost is \$10.00, with no minimum participants but a maximum of 50.

If we do not get enough interest in these make and take options, we will have to cancel them and your money will be refunded at convention.

- Saturday Banquet: Apple chutney grilled pork chop with apple chutney over garlic mashed potatoes. Mixed green salad.

Proposed Bylaws Change

As part of the annual meeting, there will be a vote on a potential bylaws change being recommended by the council. In article VI, Section 1, they are proposing that we add the following statement: "The council has the right to modify the date outside of February in the event of necessity".
