## Proposed Bylaws Changes

The council has recommended two changes to the state bylaws and those recommendations will come before the delegates at the annual meeting on Saturday, February 5. If you do not want to attend in person, there is a virtual meeting zoom option available. Things that appear ~~like this~~ are suggested to be removed and those in red would be added. The recommended changes include:

### ARTICLE V - Council Officers and Directors

Section 5 C. Vice President: The vice president shall be elected by delegates at the annual meeting from among candidates identified by the nominating committee **and/or** nominated from the floor at the annual meeting. **Any candidate nominated from the committee and/or the floor, must have proof of a background check that has occurred within the last twelve (12) months.** The term of the vice president is one year.

### ARTICLE X – Dissolution

**Section I.** With previous notice to the membership and a two-thirds affirmative vote of the members present at the time of the vote, the **Wisconsin FFA Alumni and Supporters Association, Inc.,** may be dissolved. Motion for dissolution may be presented at the annual meeting or a special meeting of the membership. **Previous notice must be provided for dissolution, either directly or indirectly, to all current active registered paid membership at the time of dissolution consideration.**

**Section II.** Upon the dissolution of the **Wisconsin FFA Alumni and Supporters Association Inc., funds and/or assets remaining, after payment settlement of all debts and liabilities are satisfied, will be distributed evenly to all Wisconsin Association chapters that are considered to be active during the year of dissolution. will be given to the Wisconsin FFA Foundation.** Whereas if the Wisconsin FFA Foundation is unable to accept or receive the said funds and/or assets from the Wisconsin FFA Alumni and Supporters Association, Inc., the said funds and assets will be given to the Wisconsin Association of Agricultural Educators (WAAE).
